contrā + <i>acc.</i>	against
cum + <i>abl.</i>	with
dē + <i>abl.</i>	about, concerning, down, down from
ē, ex + <i>abl.</i>	from, out of
extrā + <i>acc.</i>	outside
in + <i>acc.</i>	into, onto
in + <i>abl.</i>	in, on
inter + <i>acc.</i>	between, among, during
per + <i>acc.</i>	through, along, throughout
post + <i>acc.</i>	after, behind
pro + <i>abl.</i>	for, on behalf of, in return for, in front of
prope + <i>acc.</i>	near
propter + <i>acc.</i>	on account of
sine + <i>abl.</i>	without
sub + <i>abl.</i>	under

ultra + <i>acc.</i>	beyond
