

# PLANNING YOUR PLOT



- Accept the limitations of the exam. You have around one hour to write three pages.
- Know how your story will end.
- A simple story, well told will earn more marks than a complicated, disorganised tale.

#### AVOID...

- War stories
- Terrorist attacks
- Natural disasters
- The Big Match
- Crime
- Ghost stories
- Rewrites of fantasy novels you have read or films you have seen
- Any form of zombie

## FOCUS ON...

- Real people
- Real relationships
- Remember, you like your friends even though they rarely if ever
  fight battles, battle crime or flee from lava.

# STRUCTURE



- Introduction
- Complication
- Resolution

# CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:

- Narrative viewpoint: who is telling the story?
- Setting: where is the story set? It should be a place you know well or have thoroughly researched.
- Characters: limit these to one or two, if possible.
- Tense: are you writing in the past or the present tense? Decide in advance and stick to your chosen tense.

### THEME



- What is the message of your story?
- Love?
- Betrayal?
- Revenge?
- Strength?
- Ambition?


# CONFLICT

- This does not have to be physical. In fact, it's better if it's not.
- The character could be fighting with another person
- The character could be struggling with an aspect of their own personality
- The character may be battling an issue like bullying

### SUSPENSE

- Keep the reader guessing
- Build up the tension until the reader wonders what will happen
- Dialogue is a good way of adding drama and realism to your story

### CLIMAX / TURNING POINT



Make sure that the reader is very clear as to what happens here. It might be clear in your head, but that's not the point.

# ENDING

- The examiner will mark your work after he or she reads the final paragraph, so a weak ending will cost you marks.
- The reader should be satisfied with the ending and feel that all loose ends have been tied up.
- There is no need to explain how the events of the story affected the character for the rest of his or her life. The reader can guess if necessary.
- Surprise endings are great, if you can manage them and they make sense.
